All Maine Peace, Justice, Social and Political Advocates are invited to join and march with us. Placards and banners will be available, but feel free to bring placards and banners promoting "Give Peace a Chance" or your cause. Whether it be free healthcare for all, improving public transportation, providing safe childcare, protecting the environment, lifting the minimum wage, ending domestic violence, promoting clean elections or whatever, join us and march in Hallowell.

The Rachel Craig-Tom Sturtevant Peace Brigade, composed of Augusta Women in Black and Veterans for Peace, has been marching in the Old Hallowell Day Parade since 2002. During that time, we have won two first prize trophies and three second place red ribbons. Over a decade ago, the Winslow 4th of July parade committee refused the Waterville-Winslow Bridges for Peace request for a float. The Augusta Women in Black, which had marched in previous Hallowell parades, invited the Waterville-Winslow group to join them in the parade, and in turn, Hallowell parade officials extended the invitation with a "Everyone marches in Hallowell". The theme for this year's entry is Sing for Peace, reflecting the people's wish to "Give Peace a Chance".
